Drug Take Back Prescription Drug Take-Back Day

When you're done with prescription medicine, it's easy to forget about it as it sits unused in a drawer or medicine cabinet. But keeping unneeded medicine in the house is not a good idea, as it can harm children, pets, teens and adults if accidentally ingested or misused.

SWACO provides Franklin County residents with information about and access to safe disposal options for expired, unused or unwanted prescription drugs. Proper disposal is important because it helps protect the environment, our loved ones and our communities.

SWACO supports the DEA National Prescription Drug Take-Back Days, held in April and October each year, by partnering with different communities in Franklin County to host collection events.
